"**Accept**" is a verb that means "to take something offered" or "to recognize you're responsible for something".

**Example**: I'm prepared to accept the consequences.

"Except" is both a preposition and conjunction, and it introduces the only person, thing, or fact that's not included in the main statement.

**Example**: We haven't told anyone except Leo's dad.
