Coordinating Conjunctions

A coordinating conjunction is a conjunction that connects words, phrases, or clauses in a sentence.

The seven coordinating conjunctions are for, and, nor, but, or, yet, and so.

Example: Felicity bought apples **and** oranges at the market.
