

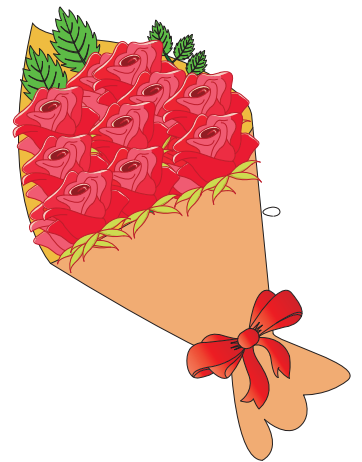
Finding Direct Objects

A direct object is a word or phrase denoting the receiver of the action of a verb. It answers the question "what" or "who"

Example: Elizabeth wrote an article for the school magazine.
