

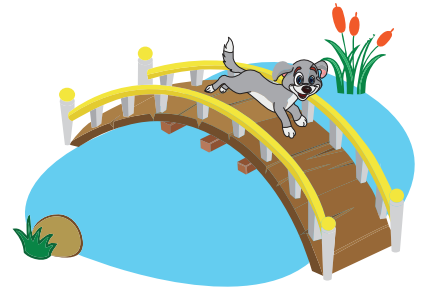
Prepositions of Direction
