

Sea Lions

Sea lions, like seals, are marine mammals, but they have some distinct features that set them apart. Sea lions have long, strong front flippers that they use to propel themselves through the water with speed and agility. Unlike seals, sea lions have the ability to rotate their hind flippers forward, allowing them to move efficiently on land, where they often form colonies. They have a visible external ear

flap, which is absent in seals. Sea lions are known for their playful and social behavior, often seen basking in the sun on rocky shores. They are excellent divers and can dive deep into the ocean to hunt for fish. Sea lions also communicate with each other through a range of vocalizations, including barks and roars.
