As more states joined the Union, the flag continued to evolve. The 34-star flag was used during the American Civil War, and it represented the 34 states in the Union.

The flag with 50 stars representing the 50 states in the Union was designed in 1958 by an Ohio high school student named Robert G. Heft. This design, with the stars arranged in rows of five, was chosen and officially adopted on July 4, 1960, after Hawaii became a state.
