

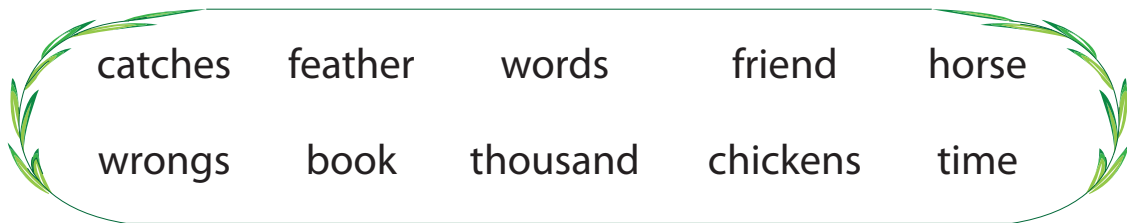
# Proverbs
